5 Woolley GrangeWiltshire

This sumptuous 25-room Jacobean manor in 14 acres close to Longleat was the first member of Luxury Family Hotels (luxuryfamilyhotels.co.uk). Small, cosily luxurious and comprehensively family-friendly, it retains a loyal following. It has everything from a heated pool and crèche to children's teas and a room-service menu that includes purée. Parents focus on the small spa, Mark Bradbury's farm-fresh British food and the cocktails. In summer, Woolley goes into overdrive, with mask-making, mini Olympics and rounders.

The subtropical Tresco in the Isles of Scilly is a car-free haven for safe swimming, messing around in boats, bike rides and short hikes. These split-level stone houses come with private beach and hotel-style service; there are nine one-bedroom cottages and options for three-bedroom versions. Meals are taken in the Ruin Beach Café, where sandy-footed kids are welcomed with mini menus. A tennis court, croquet lawn, sailing centre and golf club keep kids amused and parents have their own sauna, hot tub and gym, plus access to the Flying Boat Club spa. If you don't
